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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The objective of the Pender Alternative Special Situations Fund (the “Fund”) is to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in Canadian and US equities with the ability to also invest in debt and other securities. The Fund seeks to identify investment opportunities that are believed to represent special situations.

PenderFund Capital Management Ltd. (“Pender”) is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund.

Risks

The risks of investing in the Fund are outlined in the Simplified Prospectus dated June 27, 2023. Effective September 1, 2022, Pender Special Situations Fund was converted from a conventional mutual fund to an alternative mutual fund and renamed Pender Alternative Special Situations Fund. The objectives of the Fund were changed in the year, with unitholder approval, however, the change did not affect the Fund’s overall level of risk during the year. Further, there were no other significant changes in the Fund’s objectives and strategies that affected its overall level of risk during the year.

The nature of the Fund’s investing activities exposes it to various risks, including but not limited to inflation and the impact of central bank measures on the economy, the state of M&A markets, geopolitical and other global events, factors that are beyond the Fund’s control.

Future developments in these challenging areas could impact the Fund’s results and financial condition and the full extent of that impact remains unknown. Developing reliable estimates and applying judgment continue to be substantially complex. Actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Results of Operations

The net assets of the Fund were \$1,705,594 as at December 31, 2023 versus \$1,239,554 as at December 31, 2022. Of this \$466,040 increase, \$320,842 is attributable to positive investment performance and \$145,198 is attributable to net unitholder purchases of Fund units.

For the year ended December 31, 2023, Class A units of the Fund generated a total return of 23.0%. Returns for other classes of the Fund will be similar to Class A with any difference in performance being primarily due to the different management fees that are applicable to different classes. Please see the “Past Performance” section for the performance of the Fund’s other classes.

The Fund’s broad-based benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Index (“S&P/TSX”), returned 11.8% during the year. In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, we have included a comparison to this broad-based index to help you understand the Fund’s performance relative to the general performance of the market, but we caution that the Fund’s mandate may be significantly different from the index. Further, the Fund’s returns are reported net of all management fees and expenses for all classes, unlike the returns of the Fund’s benchmark, which are based on the performance of an index that does not pay fees or incur expenses.

The following comments and the comments under “Recent Developments” reflect the views of the portfolio management team and are based on information as at the end of the year. Please read the caution regarding forward-looking statements located on the last page of this document.

The Fund transitioned from a traditional mutual fund to a liquid alternative in 2022. This allows the Fund additional tools for portfolio management, such as shorting securities and adding leverage to positions where appropriate. In 2023, key positive individual contributors to the Fund’s performance for the year included Burford Capital Limited, Thinkific Labs Inc., and Glass House Brands Inc. Conversely, Pluribus Technologies Corp., Velan Inc., and dentalcorp Holdings Ltd. had the largest adverse impact.

As at the end of the year, the Fund was 69.2% invested in Canada, 40.2% in the United States and 5.9% internationally and had a bank overdraft of -15.3%. The Fund’s cash position may change over time as a result of portfolio transactions. The Fund’s investment portfolio is concentrated and not diversified in the conventional sense. The Fund’s top 10 holdings account for 71.3% of the Fund’s net assets at the end of the year. This concentration may lead to varied results over any given year.

The overall sector exposure of the Fund is determined by stock selection decisions and may shift from time to time. As at December 31, 2023 we were weighted toward holdings in the Information Technology, Financial Services, and Energy sectors, because those are the sectors where we currently believe we are finding the best investment opportunities and, equally important, because they contain businesses for which we are best equipped to assess value. These top three sectors accounted for 59.6% of the Fund at the end of the year.

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Recent Developments

Interest rate policy from the US Federal Reserve was squarely in focus during the period, with commentary signaling the end of their interest rate hiking campaign and underscoring the market narrative of an upcoming pivot to interest rate cuts in 2024. This underpinned a rally across virtually all asset classes, highlighted by the Federal Open Market Committee (“FOMC”) meeting on December 13 which was the best FOMC meeting day for all assets in almost 15 years. With the sharp rally, equity indices pushed higher to fresh 52-week highs near the end of the year. The bond market also took its cues from the Fed and digested these shifting expectations with the US 10-year Treasury yields at 3.9% at the end of the year and credit spreads tightening.

One of the key themes for equity markets throughout most of 2023 was the narrow leadership of a handful of mega-cap technology companies. Through the first three quarters of the year, seven companies in the S&P 500 contributed nearly 85% of the gains. This group included Apple Inc. (Nasdaq: AAPL), Microsoft Corporation (Nasdaq: MSFT), NVIDIA Corporation (Nasdaq: NVDA), Alphabet Inc. (Nasdaq: GOOGL), Amazon.com, Inc. (Nasdaq: AMZN), Meta Platforms, Inc. (Nasdaq: META) and Tesla, Inc. (Nasdaq: TSLA). As another sign of narrow leadership, the average company in the S&P 500 gained a meager 2.4% compared to the overall index performance of approximately 13% through the first three quarters of 2023.

This trend changed dramatically in the fourth quarter, with those same seven companies contributing around 35.0% to overall S&P 500 performance and the average company gaining 11.8%. This broad-based participation in the market rally with the contribution from smaller companies much more in line with their weight in the index is a positive signal that the momentum in these mega-cap technology firms may finally be waning.

We are positioning the Fund to be opportunistic and take advantage of a variety of new opportunities as they emerge. This includes a focus on finding growth companies with positive or secular tailwinds that we believe are mispriced; companies with dislocated valuations with identifiable catalysts to narrow the valuation gap; M&A driven investment opportunities and other short-term mispricing and capital markets driven trading opportunities.

Independent Review Committee (“IRC”) Appointments & Resignations

Effective March 31, 2023, Kerry Ho ceased to be the Chair of the IRC and Leslie Wood became Chair of the IRC.

Related Party Transactions

The Fund pays management and administration fees to the Manager for management and portfolio advisory services (see “Management Fees”). The Fund also pays the Manager performance fees (see “Performance Fees”).

As at the end of the year, parties related to the Manager collectively held 18% of the Fund’s units.

Management Fees

The Fund pays management and administration fees calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of each respective class. The Management Expense Ratio (“MER”) before applicable taxes such as GST or HST for each class does not exceed certain levels as set out in the Fund’s offering documents. The fees are calculated at the close of business on each valuation day and are paid monthly. In exchange for the administration fee, the Manager pays the operating costs of the Fund. During the year the Manager waived management and administration fees and custody related transaction costs for the Fund.

Management fees are used by the Manager, in part, to pay sales commissions, trailer fees, marketing costs and other associated distribution costs relating to the sale of units of the Fund.

Such expenses represented approximately 21% of the management fees paid by the Fund to the Manager for the year.

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Performance Fees

The Manager is also entitled to a performance fee plus applicable taxes such as GST or HST on all classes of units of the Fund. For Class O units, this fee is or will be charged directly to Unitholders, as applicable. The performance fee is equal to 15% of the amount by which the total return of the class of units exceeds a 6% hurdle rate, for the year since the performance fee was last paid, provided that the total return of the relevant class of units for such year exceeds the previous high-water mark. The high-water mark is the net asset value of the applicable class of units to which it applies as at the most recent determination date on which a performance fee was payable. Performance fees will be calculated and accrued daily, and such accrued fees will be payable by the Fund at the end of each year. The Manager has reserved the right to change the year for which any performance fee may be paid by a Fund. The Manager, at its discretion, may reduce or waive performance fees.

(b) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the year and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year. The MER may vary from one class of units to another because of differences in the applicable management fees and certain fees and expenses may have been absorbed by the Manager which would otherwise be paid by the Fund. Management expense ratio before performance fee is the MER before any performance fees, if applicable, for the stated year.

(c) The Manager of the Fund has agreed to absorb sufficient expenses of the Fund, as necessary, so that the annual MER before applicable taxes such as GST or HST will not exceed certain limits as outlined in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus. The amount of expenses absorbed is at the discretion of the Manager as set out in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus and the Manager may in its sole discretion cease to absorb expenses.

(d) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year.

(e) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. In general, the higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

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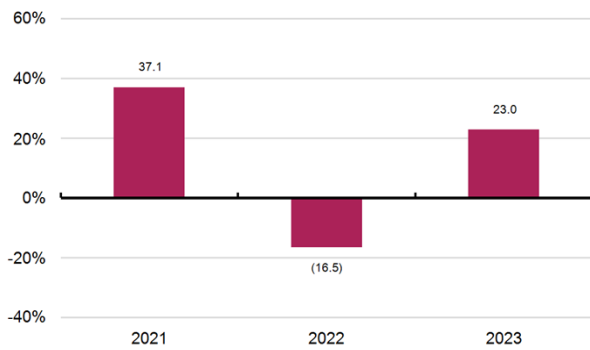
Past Performance

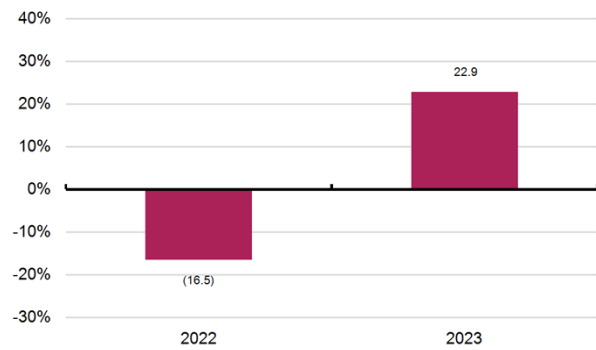
Year-by-Year Returns

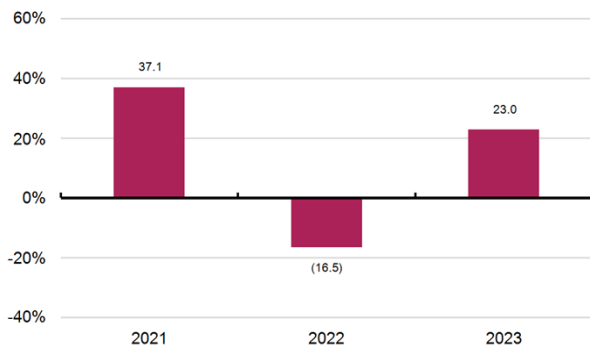

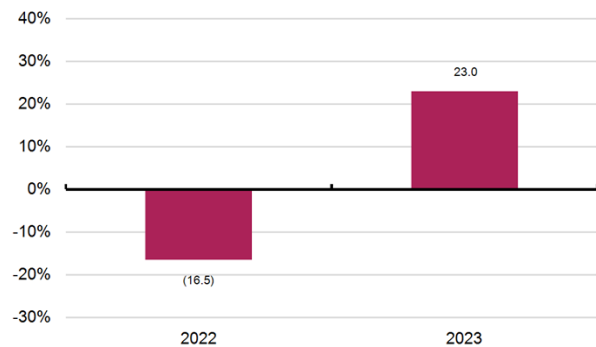

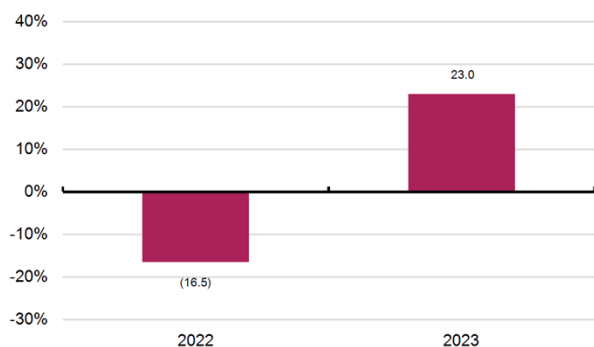

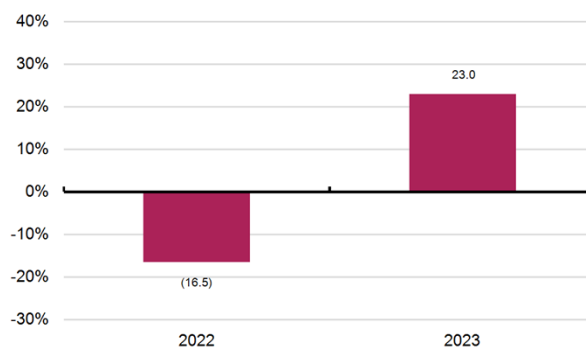

Annual Compound Returns

The annual compound returns table compares the Fund's performance to one or more benchmarks. Benchmarks are usually an index or a composite of more than one index. An index is generally made up of a group of securities. Since the Fund does not necessarily invest in the same securities as an index or in the same proportion, the Fund's performance is not expected to equal the performance of the index. Fund returns are reported net of all management fees and expenses for all classes (prior to June 30, 2021, the Fund's MER was inclusive of applicable taxes such as GST or HST), unlike the returns of the Fund's benchmark, which are based on the performance of an index that does not pay fees or incur expenses. It may be more helpful to compare the Fund's performance to that of other mutual funds with similar objectives and investment strategies.

The Fund's broad-based benchmark is S&P/TSX Composite Index. The S&P/TSX is the headline index for the Canadian equity market. With approximately 95% coverage of the Canadian equities market, it is the primary gauge for Canadian-based, Toronto Stock Exchange listed companies.
